
Chords (Part 2)


So far we have looked at how we can use some chord formations to play other chords by moving them further up the fretboard. We will now look at how we can move fairly easily between chords using these barre chords. We will start by looking at some of the main chords we can play by barring on each of the frets between 2 and 5.



You should now be able to work out which chords you can play as you move even further along the fretboard.

We will now look at common groupings of chords, and how to easily change chords using barre chords.

We have previously seen that many songs use 4 related chords. In the key of C these chords are C, Am, F, & G; in G they are G, Em, C, & D; in F they are F, Dm, Bb, & C. The fingering for the chords in F are the ones we will use as we saw in Part 1.



So starting with

you can easily change to Em by placing your little finger behind




your ring finger on fret 4 of the C string.

To move on to C, move the barre up one




fret, and move your middle finger across to the C string and lift your little finger



then move up 2 more frets to fret 5 to play D.


We can move the chords up 2 more frets with the barre on fret 4 to play the same sequence in the key of A. The chords become A, F#m, D, & E

Now we will look at chords we use to play the same sequence in D. The chords in D are D,



Bm, G, & A. A D F# D B D F# B B D G B C# E A C# From D lift little finger & place ring finger for Bm. Add middle finger for G, then move whole chord up 2 frets for A.

Moving these chords up 2 frets enables us to play the sequence in the key of E. We rarely play songs in the key of E because it is too difficult on a ukulele, However, this makes it




easier for us.

We now need to practice some of these chords, and attached are a couple of songs to help.


