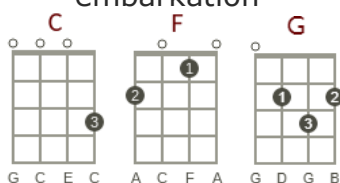


## Pokarekare Ana.
